WHY CANADA AND TORONTO?

We have a strong foundation in Toronto on which a spectacular event can grow. Toronto offers speedcubers, officials, staff, volunteers, spectators and media an environment where success thrives. With an outstanding track record in hosting major events including 2019 Special Olympics Invitational Youth Games, 2019 WWE SummerSlam, 2017 Invictus Games, 2019 Senior PanAM Fencing Championships, the world-renowned Toronto International Film Festival and the largest Caribbean Carnival in North America, Toronto is one of the world's most diverse and inclusive cities. It's also safe and accessible, easily capable of handling the logistical components of the WCA North American Championship 2020.

HOST CITY

With more than 5 million people in the Greater Toronto Area, Toronto is the 4th largest city in North America after New York, Los Angeles and Mexico City. It is modern and progressive, with a vibrant downtown core. With 51% of Torontonians born outside of Canada and more than 230 nationalities with 140 languages and dialects spoken within our city, we are proud to say we are one of the world's truly diverse destinations. Toronto is highly walkable with colourful neighbourhoods, including a concentrated downtown core brimming with shopping, entertainment, attractions and a stunningly redeveloped waterfront area that is great for scenic activities. EVENT VENUE

Catharine Benzie






Metropolitan Ballroom

PROPOSED PROGRAM

The Local Organizing Committee is prepared to host up to 1,000 competitors in Toronto!

Proposed Schedule

The competition will start Thursday morning with setup occurring the evening before. To ensure that the competition stays on schedule, a staff competition will be held each morning, Thursday through Saturday. The competition will conclude Sunday evening when we will crown the first WCA North American Champions. The competition dates conveniently align with the first weekend of school summer holidays in Canada and Mexico. The United States will be at the mid-point of school summer holidays.

Proposed Competitor Limit

The Local Organizing Team is planning for 800–1,000 competitors. We aspire to host the largest competition in North America to date.

Access for Spectators

The Metropolitan Ballroom can comfortably seat 1,600 spectators. The Local Organizing Committee plans to charge a small admission fee to help finance this event. Children under 12 years of age will be admitted for free, which will allow parents to bring the entire family!

Competition Equipment

The Metropolitan Ballroom can be configured with four stages and accommodate up to 48 timing stations. The Frontenac Ballroom can seat 200, allowing many competitors to participate in 3x3x3 Fewest Moves and blindfolded events.

Other Technologies

Sound systems and projectors are available for use in the Metropolitan Ballroom. Live streaming will be arranged so that the competition can be viewed around the world.

It's easy to get to Toronto. Choose from one of two international airports that easily connect competitors to the rest of the country and beyond. It's also easy to get around, thanks to an extensive public transit system and fleet of taxis. Once you're here, it's harder to leave because you won't want to.

Toronto Pearson International Airport (YYZ) is Canada's primary airport and the second busiest in North America, with travel connections to every continent. It ranks among the top 30 world airports for passenger traffic and aircraft movement and is less than a 90-minute flight for over 100 million Americans. The UP Express train connects Toronto Pearson to the downtown core by a 25-minute direct transfer running every 15 minutes.

Located in the downtown core is Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport (YTZ). Billy Bishop offers flights to over 20 cities in Canada and the U.S., with connections to more than 80 international destinations. It is easily accessible by a 5-minute ferry ride or through its underground pedestrian tunnel.

Explore Toronto with one of North America's best transport systems, the Toronto Transit Commission (TTC). With subways, buses and streetcars at every corner, getting around the city is a breeze. A single fare takes you anywhere on a one-way trip.

You can transfer between subways, streetcars and buses, and always keep your transfer as proof of payment.

GO Transit is Ontario's inter-regional bus and train service. It links Toronto with the Greater Toronto Area and beyond. This allows local competitors from neighbouring cities to easily access the competition venue via Toronto's Union Station.

Other forms of transportation include taxis, rideshare services and cycling. Toronto has cycling paths throughout the city that can get you where you're going safely. The city also has a robust bike share system, offering 24/7 access to 5,000 bikes at 465 stations across the city.


CANADA HAS ONE OF THE MOST ADVANCED CUSTOMS PROCESSES IN THE WORLD

Canadians and international visitors alike can enter Toronto with the security and ease of travel they expect. Visitors to Canada must clear the customs border security upon entry into the country.

The U.S. government implemented the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI) in an effort to streamline travel across the border and increase security. Tourism Toronto is committed to working with the Local Organizing Committee to ensure ease of travel for those travelling to Toronto for the competition. The Canadian government understands that a pivotal part of holding a successful Toronto event is making it easy for planners to bring materials, staff, and exhibits into Canada. By working closely with the meetings, conventions and incentive travel industry, the government continues to implement policies and procedures geared towards simplifying the entire process. A customs broker can help coordinate and expedite the import of all exhibit and display materials into Canada on behalf of those affiliated with the WCA North American Championship.

Canada introduced a new entry requirement, known as an eTA, for visa-exempt foreign nationals travelling to Canada by air. Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travellers with a valid visa. Entry requirements for other methods of travel (land and sea) have not changed. Eligible travellers can apply online for an eTA. As of March 15, 2016, this is mandatory and travellers will need an eTA before they can board a flight to Canada.

Toronto is Canada's number one media hub, and the fourth largest in North America. Headquarters for the nation's major newspapers, magazines, television and radio programming are located in Canada's Downtown.

Many of Canada's primary broadcasting stations, including the CBC and CTV, and national newspapers, including The Globe & Mail and the National Post, are headquartered in Toronto. The city is also home to several other major local and regional media outlets, including the Toronto Star, which boasts the largest readership in the country.

Thanks to Toronto's multicultural diversity, you'll have access to more than 100 ethnic newspapers, including 11 non-English dailies published in and around the city. The WCA will benefit from Toronto's extensive media outlets, many of which are already familiar with speedcubing and the work of the WCA, thanks to prior coverage of the Canadian speedcubing community.
